

## **Keynote Speaker: Glennray Tutor**



#### Bio:

Working in the still life tradition of 17th century Dutch painters, Glennray Tutor elicits a sense of wonder from his viewers through the direct presentation of contemporary commonplace items. Home canned as well as store-bought jars of vegetables, fruit, jellies; toys; fireworks; candies; marbles; all of these transformed into visual treasures. "He draws us into his painted world to marvel at the commonplace artifacts of daily life and, through his mastery of the painting technique, shows them to us as if we are seeing them for the first time."

His painted objects protrude as 3-dimensional objects into


His painted objects protrude as 3-dimensional objects into the viewer's space. Presenting his subjects distilled

through the techniques of 17th Century Dutch masters into a 21st Century hyper-realism, Tutor coyly reminds us that truth and illusion are partners in the artist's game. He draws us into his paintings to marvel at the artifacts of daily life, as if seeing them for the first time. We are magically given new, heightened awareness of shapes, colors, contents through Tutor's impeccable painting technique and surface finish. Perhaps he invites us to



speculate about the nature of his artistic metaphors, for the images abound with suggestions and allusions. Barry Hannah once wrote "The paintings of Tutor are like life after a glaucoma operation. A whole new vision is given to us." "My work is all about the renewal of the sense of wonder," Tutor says. "I'm celebrating being here in this miraculous existence."

# Material Intuition and Experimentation with Bailey Hughes



In this workshop we will learn to work intuitively with a large variety of materials as we practice our ability to sustain focus and work in series. Play will be our process as we engage materials and techniques to expand our personal visual vocabulary. We will release the pressure of making finished work by working in series and on multiple surfaces. By the end of class, you will have developed a mixed media series of works completely unique to your style and abilities. The goal of this workshop is to learn to listen more closely to the desires of the materials themselves and allow meaning to come slowly over time. mixed media.










Robin Martéa is a fine artist and illustrator whose work has

appeared in the Mississippi Governor's Mansion and the University of Mississippi Medical Center's permanent installation. She's been featured in numerous publications including the "Mississippi Free Press" and Jackson Comics. Robin's design for the Mississippi State Flag in 2020, made national headlines when it was featured on CNN Style. She earned her Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Alabama at Birmingham and received her Master of Fine Arts degree in Illustration from the Savannah College of Art and Design. "I like to think of my paintings as a window into my daydreams. Chasing my dreams is often done in the most

unconventional way: through a brush and a canvas. My art, which is a direct





reflection of my imagination, is illustrated through drawings that are grounded in hope. What motivates me are the works of artists and illustrators whose art tells a story in an imaginative way. When viewing my work, I'd like for the audience to bring all their aspirations to the table. Whether young or old, my hope is that they leave with their minds full of imagination and their hearts full of inspiration."

### Reencounter Art in the Human Form: An Artistic Transformation with Andrew Young



In this workshop, participants will explore live figure drawing like never before. Using a wide range of drawing and painting materials, participants will be guided through a series of traditional drawing exercises such as gesture and contour of the draped live model by professional artist, Andrew Young. Afterwards, participants will prepare to collage a final art surface that explores the interlocking planes and multi-dimensional expressions of the human figure. **Limit 20 participants.** 

Since establishing Pearl River Glass in 1975, Andrew has always been one of the


forerunners in stained glass innovation, pioneering such techniques as fused glass in leaded windows and using the time-honored technique of acid etching in new and modern ways. Andrew has served as the President of the Stained Glass Association of America. His extensive education in the field includes study with Ludwig Schaffrath, H. G. Von Stochausen, and the master iconographer Vladislav Andrejev. He also received a Degree in "Education for Ministry" from the University of the South in Sewanee, TN, which makes him uniquely qualified to incorporate the subtle aspects of theology into the many church windows he creates. In 1987 he was awarded a grant from the Mississippi Arts Commission to see the gothic cathedrals of Europe as well as tour many of Europe's oldest and most renowned glass



companies. In Waldsassen, Germany, he was also given a personal tour of the Lamberts Glass factory. In 2002 Andrew was awarded the Mississippi Governor's Excellence in the Arts Award, Artist Achievement, 2002. Andrew was awarded the Lifetime Achievement Award by the Mississippi Institute of Arts and Letters in 2018. In 2016 he received the Lifetime Achievement award from the Craftsman's Guild of Mississippi.
